Dear Mrs. Janssen,

Thank you for contacting the Europe Direct Contact Centre and for sharing your views.

The European Commission agrees that there is a need for constant updates to scientific knowledge. It funds research through its Framework Programmes on health impacts of exposure to electromagnetic fields (EMF).

Since 2000, more than EUR 37 million have been spent on research on EMF. An example of a project looking at the potential health effects of EMF is GERONIMO. However, the Commission has not conducted studies on potential health risks of 5G technology.

In the context of 5G, the Commission is engaged in discussions with the Member States in the Communications Committee, who assists the Commission in carrying out its executive powers, to establish an overview of national approaches for the protection against non-ionizing radiation.

Current scientific evidence has not linked EMF below the limits recommended by Council Recommendation 1999/519/EC(3) with adverse health problems.

As 5G is expected to use smaller cells with lower power levels, the overall EMF exposure would be distributed more evenly and, therefore, is likely to even decrease in areas where 5G is deployed.

The European Commission's Scientific Committee on Health, Environmental and Emerging Risks (SCHEER) has a standing mandate to provide an independent update of the scientific evidence available, including the assessment of health risks that may be associated with exposure. The Committee has already produced five relevant opinions.

These opinions have not provided any scientific justification to revise the limits set by Council Recommendation 1999/519/EC on the exposure of the general public to electromagnetic fields. These limits are based on guidance issued by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP). The ICNIRP is currently reviewing its guidelines and presenting them for public

consultation. The Commission is looking forward to the conclusions. The SCHEER may reassess the situation depending on the outcome of this review.

Under Article 168 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, the primary responsibility for protecting the public from potential harmful effects of electromagnetic fields remains with the Member States, including the choice of measures to be adopted based on age and health status.

The Commission also notes that the European Electronic Communications Code, recently agreed by the co-legislators, will require Member States to pursue consistency and predictability throughout the Union regarding the way the use of radio spectrum is authorised in protecting public health.
